**LOVE GIFT** is the over-and-above offering of American Baptist Women. It is an integral part of our United Mission, which provides for every aspect of our denomination's ministry, including American Baptist Women's Ministries. Love Gift is an everyday and personal offering. An opportunity to contribute to Love Gift should be given at each ABW Ministries meeting. Contributions should be given through your local church treasurer and marked "Love Gift." Your church treasurer will send the Love Gift to ABCUSA with the church's monthly report of Mission Support.

The **NATIONAL LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT FUND** provides opportunities for developing leadership potential in women who are related to American Baptist work in this country and overseas. Gifts to this fund can be sent through the state treasurer in honor or in memory of individuals who have influenced the lives of the donor. The gift is then forwarded to Valley Forge, and a list of honorees and donors is entered into the Book of Remembrances in the national office of ABW Ministries. Statewide, the fund is to assist with state training for potential leaders or for spiritual events such as Oasis retreats and area/regional gatherings. These gifts should be sent to the State or local Treasurer.

**ABGIRLS** contributions help to encourage and support these girls to grow and share as young women of God and to take the steps necessary to become adult women God. Money from this fund goes for scholarship opportunities for conference attendees who might otherwise not be able to attend conference. The development of programs and conference expenses are also offset by this fund.

American Baptist Women's Ministries' logo expresses the boldness of our faith as women compelled by our commitment to Christ to act for change in the world. It expresses the simplicity of our mission statement as a Christ-centered organization serving to encourage and empower women and girls. It expresses our partnership in the community of American Baptist Churches USA, and it expresses our emphasis on ministry with women and girls.



**What is AB GIRLS?** AB GIRLS is a ministry focused upon meeting the spiritual needs of girls as they move through the many changes their lives will take as they grow into adulthood.

**Why just girls?** We all know that girls and boys are different and, at times, have very different needs. We also know that sometimes youth are less inclined to speak up in mixed crowds, and often hold back from sharing their true feelings around boys and men. AB GIRLS ministry is designed to complement the Christian Education and youth ministry programs in a congregation. AB GIRLS is a way for girls to have the opportunity to deal with tough questions honestly, to build close relationships with each other, and to build a program that will meet their particular needs as growing women of faith.

**How is AB GIRLS organized?** Your ministry with girls may be organized any way that fits your situation best. AB Women's Ministries produces resources for girls in three age ranges: Girls of Joy (ages 8-11, grades 3-5); Girls of Faith (ages 12-14, grades 6-8); and Young Women of Hope (ages 15-18, grades 9-12). Most resources can be easily adapted for a variety of age ranges.

## Did you know...?

### 2016 is the 65<sup>th</sup> anniversary of American Baptist Women's Ministries!



In 1951, the National Council of American Baptist Women was formed to create a national organization to which each American Baptist woman could belong, and to expand the ministry to include the total mission of the church, including missions with women in the U.S., Puerto Rico, and all over the world. Women

wanted to be able to elect their own officers and chairpersons who could focus their energy on the needs of American Baptist women and all that these women could accomplish by working together. They also wanted a focus on leadership development of women to develop a greater capacity for ministry and mission.

In 1965, the name was shortened to American Baptist Women, and in 1990 we became American Baptist Women's Ministries to emphasize the ministries and mission we engage in as women of faith.



AB Women's Ministries is taking the celebration of our 65th anniversary as a time to honor our past and all those visionary, courageous women who have come before, and to look towards the future that God is unfolding in us, through us, and for us! ## OFFERINGS

**LOCAL (REGION) DUES** provide funds for our Region ABWM so we can pay for our expenses such as postage, speakers, officers' expenses, and miscellaneous annual requests.

**GENERAL FUND OF ABW MINISTRIES OF NYS** enables the state officers to keep connected with the needs of the associations and local ministries. This includes expenses for speaking engagements, facilitating events, board meetings, and "A Witness" (ABWM/NYS newsletter)

**ABW/NYS MISSION PROJECT** is announced at convention each year. It will be a state need, a national need, or an international need. Contributions to this fund enable ABW Ministries NYS to meet the goal set by the committee.

**ABW/NYS SCHOLARSHIP FUND** is administered by the State Scholarship Committee. Awards vary with the needs of the individual and the amount in the fund. Applicants must be members of an American Baptist Church, female, and taking a full-time course of study. There is no age restriction. Applications are available from the committee chairwoman. Scholarship women are assigned to each association each year. Groups/individuals are encouraged to contact their scholarship woman during the college year with cards and notes of encouragement.

The **REFIT FUND** is an American Baptist support fund for missionaries who are preparing to go to the mission field and need specific materials to live and survive in their assignment area. It also supports missionaries who are returning to home assignments and may need help with clothing or housing expenses while they are here.

**NATIONAL SUPPORT** gifts make possible the work of national officers who plan programs and activities; development of resources to enrich our ministry at every level; and employment of capable staff and the maintenance of a national office to make all this possible.

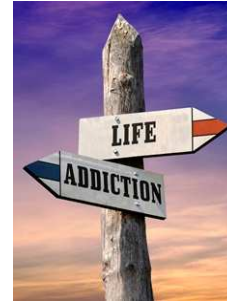

## 2016-2017 Mission Focus *"See...The Suffering: Drug Addiction"*



While the good news is that alcohol use and cigarette smoking among 8<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> graders has dropped overall since 1995, the bad news is that there's been little real change in illicit drug use during that same time period. In a 2015 study, 8% of 8<sup>th</sup> graders, 16.5% of 10<sup>th</sup> graders, and nearly 24% of 12<sup>th</sup> graders reported using illicit drugs in the past month.<sup>1</sup>

In 1999, 418 adults aged 18-24 died from a prescription drug overdose. In 2014, that number was 1,741: or nearly five people a day. For every death due to a prescription drug overdose, there were 119 emergency room visits and 22 treatment admissions.<sup>2</sup>

Nearly 48,000 women died of prescription painkiller (opioid) overdoses between 1999 and 2010. The rate of women dying from overdoses of prescription painkillers has increased nearly 400% in that time, compared to 265% increase among men. Women are more likely to be prescribed painkillers at higher doses and use them for longer times than men.<sup>3</sup>

**Drug addiction isn't something that's "someone else's problem," or something that could never happen in your church. Given the statistics, it's quite likely that someone sitting in church with you on Sunday morning is struggling with addiction, or has a family member struggling with addiction.**
